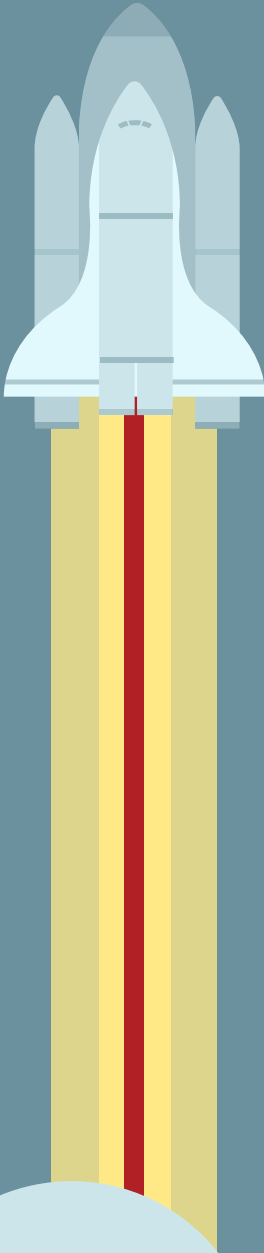

INTRODUCTION

Are you looking for an internship to gain practical skills and develop your interests?

Internships are ideal opportunities to:

- gain professional experience,
- boost your CV,
- build a professional and personal network,
- acquire useful skills,
- guide your career choices,

and also to better understand your talents and interests while exploring different fields of activity, which will help you with your educational and career orientation decisions.



Intrigued? Then you're in the right place! This edition of *Boost!* will guide you through the world of internships and help you find the perfect match!


SCHOOL AND CAREER ORIENTATION INTERNSHIPS



ORIENTATION INTERNSHIP BY YOUR SCHOOL (SCHNUPPERSTAGE)

School or career orientation internships are short-term internships that allow you a glimpse behind the scenes of a job! Normally, these internships last from a few days to 2 weeks.


During your internship, you are covered by a special accident insurance. Your school's guidance and integration unit (*cellule d'orientation et d'intégration scolaires*) can help you find a place.

ORIENTATION INTERNSHIP ORGANISED BY THE SNJ (STAGE DE DÉCOUVERTE)

There's also a voluntary version of this internship offered by the National Youth Service (SNJ). Their local branches can help you find a short internship in private companies, associations, or public services.

These internships usually last from one to four weeks, and are based on individual counselling from the SNJ to help you find the perfect experience. During your internship, you are covered by a special accident insurance.

MANDATORY INTERNSHIPS REQUIRED AS PART OF THE SCHOOL OR UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM



These mandatory internships are a fixed part of your school programme, whether you're studying in Luxembourg or abroad. In other words, they are required internships that are part of your school or university curriculum.

They are organised through your secondary or higher education institution, and are essential for completing your studies.



Insurance covered by the educational institution

CONDITIONS

You are enrolled in a secondary or higher education institution (high school, BTS, Bachelor, Master, etc.).

MUST-KNOW



This category of internships, whose provisions are included in the Labour Code, does not cover School or Career Orientation Internships ("Schnupperstage") or professional training internships for specific professions ("apprentissage").

COMPENSATION

DURATION	COMPENSATION
< 4 weeks	not mandatory
≥ 4 weeks	30% of the non-qualified social minimum wage
exception	no obligation for compensation if the educational institution expressly prohibits compensation

! This is the required minimum compensation. A company can however decide to pay you more! These provisions are only applicable for internships in Luxembourg. If you undertake an internship abroad, the conditions of that country apply.

VOLUNTARY INTERNSHIPS OUTSIDE THE SCHOOL OR UNIVERSITY CURRICULUM




These voluntary internships are undertaken outside your regular academic curriculum, initiated by your own desire to gain additional professional experience.


You can do such an internship if one of the following conditions applies to you.

 Insurance covered by the internship supervisor

CONDITIONS

-  You are enrolled in a secondary or higher education institution (high school, BTS, Bachelor, Master, etc.).

or...

-  After graduating (high school diploma, BTS, bachelor's degree), you can still do this type of internship if you complete it within 12 months of graduation.

MUST-KNOW

-  Have you already completed your master's degree? Then this internship category does not apply to you.

COMPENSATION

DURATION	COMPENSATION if you are not finished with a 1st cycle in higher education (BTS, Bachelor)	COMPENSATION if you finished a 1st cycle in higher education (BTS, Bachelor)
< 4 weeks	not mandatory	not mandatory
≥ 4 to ≤ 12 weeks	40% of the non-qualified social minimum wage	40% of the qualified social minimum wage
> 12 to ≤ 26 weeks	75% of the non-qualified social minimum wage	75% of the qualified social minimum wage

- ! This is the required minimum compensation. A company can however decide to pay you more! These provisions are only applicable for internships in Luxembourg. If you undertake an internship abroad, the conditions of that country apply.

The conditions, compensation and duration of these internships can vary, so it's essential to carefully check each opportunity!

INTERNSHIPS AT THE INSTITUTIONS OF THE EUROPEAN UNION

When it comes to internships in the European Union (EU), there's a world of opportunities beyond the big names such as the European Commission, the European Parliament, and the Council of the EU. Whether you're interested in economics, law, international relations, business, marketing, social sciences, or informatics, there's an internship out there for you.

Programmes like the Schuman Traineeship, the Blue Book Traineeship, and positions at the General Secretariat of the Council cover a wide range of topics and experiences. You can also find exciting internships in the Committee of the Regions and the European Economic and Social Committee. Plus, the European External Action Service offers great opportunities for those interested in international relations.

Are you passionate about politics? The political groups in the European Parliament offer internship opportunities. You can also apply directly to Members of Parliament, whether they represent your country or another. Spontaneous applications are always possible.

But that's not all! EU agencies all across Europe offer internship opportunities in diverse fields, providing additional chances to gain valuable experience. And don't forget, many major EU institutions are based in Luxembourg, offering opportunities to kickstart your career right here. Most internships open applications twice a year, with some available on a rolling basis. Start exploring and find the perfect EU internship to launch your career!

MUST-KNOW

- ! Internships in EU institutions offer you a remuneration package and insurance coverage. The remuneration can vary between institutions but is designed to help cover your costs.

UNITED NATIONS INTERNSHIPS (UN)

UN internships provide exciting opportunities in a wide range of fields. Whether you're passionate about international law, human rights, sustainable development, public health, diplomacy, social sciences, or technology, there's likely a UN traineeship for you. Numerous specialised agencies, including UNICEF, UNDP, UNESCO, WHO, and others, provide diverse internship experiences, offering you the chance to make a global impact.

Unfortunately, most UN internships are unpaid, so you'll need to cover your expenses during your time at the UN on your own. Only a few UN internship programmes offer compensation.

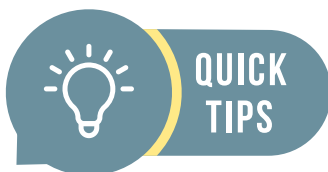
CHECKLIST FOR YOUR RESEARCH



The following non-exhaustive list offers a brief overview of different strategies you can use for your research.

CHECKLIST	EXPLANATION
Find your interests	Before starting your internship search, consider which fields interest you. This will help narrow your focus to areas that align with your passions.
Browse job portals	Not sure which company or organisation you want to intern with? Job portals are a great way to see what's out there in Luxembourg. Start with the websites we provided to discover interesting areas!
Check the websites of companies and organisations	Some organisations don't post internships on job portals. If you're interested in a specific field, check the company's website to see if they have internship opportunities.

CHECKLIST	EXPLANATION
Create a LinkedIn Account	<u>LinkedIn</u> is especially useful for students who are looking for an internship during or after their studies. The platform allows you to network with professionals, explore opportunities, and follow companies that interest you.
Make spontaneous applications	Even if a company isn't advertising internships, you can still reach out to ask about potential opportunities. Sending a spontaneous application shows initiative!
Talk to your network	Talk to your friends, family, professors, and professional contacts. Let them know that you are searching for an internship. Sometimes the best opportunities come from your network.
Attend career fairs and events	Attend career fairs and events - they're great opportunities to meet companies and organisations, learn about available internships, and explore your interests. Check out the following fairs for example: Deng Zukunft - Däi Wee, RTL Jobdag, UniCareers, etc.
