

WHAT EXACTLY IS A GAP YEAR?

A gap year is usually a period of several months to a year where you take a break from school or work to focus on personal growth, self-discovery and new experiences. You can spend this time travelling, volunteering, working or exploring career paths, all while preparing for future academic, professional or life goals. You can organise your gap year however you like, making it fit your goals and personal situation.

- **Find new interests**: Try out different jobs, hobbies and activities that could inspire your future studies or career path.
- Make your CV stand out: Gain practical experience, improve a language or volunteer to make you stand out to employers and universities.
- Meet new people and cultures: Travel, work or volunteer abroad to make meaningful connections and develop deeper intercultural understanding.
- **Broaden your horizons**: Step outside your comfort zone and experience life in a completely new environment, whether at home or abroad

WHEN CAN I TAKE A GAP YEAR?

A gap year is ideal for transitional periods in your life, such as:

- after high school and before starting higher education (Bachelor, BTS, etc.),
- between completing a Bachelor's and starting a Master's degree,
- after finishing your studies and before entering the job market,
- or simply whenever you feel ready for a new adventure!

ASK YOURSELF

To start planning your gap year, it's helpful to ask yourself a few key questions. These can guide you in figuring out your goals, preferences and needs:

QUESTIONS	IDEAS
What are my reasons for taking a gap year?	Are you looking to grow as a person, explore career paths, learn new skills, enhance your CV or recharge? There is no wrong answer - it only depends on you!
What are my goals?	Travelling, volunteering, gaining work experience, doing an internship, or pursuing a passion: these are all options that can help you pursue your aspirations.
Where do I want to spend my gap year?	Would you rather stay in Luxembourg or explore opportunities abroad? No matter where you go, you will grow as a person and collect experiences.
How can I fund my gap year?	Your plans will depend on your budget. Consider for example savings, part-time work before or during your gap year or financial support from your family.
What skills or experiences do I hope to gain?	Learning a new language, developing professional skills, improving your intercultural competence or gaining in independence and flexibility are all valuable skills that will benefit you in the long term.

	How much time do I want to dedicate to my gap year?	Your gap year doesn't have to last a full year. Consider whether a few months, a semester or a full year is the best fit for your plans.
	What activities interest me the most?	From volunteering and interning to travelling, studying, or working in a specific field, there are countless options. You don't have to choose just one!
	What are my long- term goals, and how can a gap year help me achieve them?	Use your gap year to experiment with activities that align with your future career or personal goals. This time can set the stage for your next steps and boost you towards reaching your long-term goals.
	Should I ask for advice or support from other people?	Talking to family, friends or mentors can provide you with new ideas. Hearing from people who've done a gap year can be especially inspiring and helpful.

VOLUNTEERING IN LUXEMBOURG



Volunteering is about giving your time and energy to a cause and making a difference in your community. There are lots of different ways you can get involved in volunteering in Luxembourg. You can help with animal welfare, environmental protection, culture, sports, education, health, social work and humanitarian aid.

Volunteering not only lets you contribute to a more compassionate and supportive society, but you'll also enjoy fun activities, meet new people, and gain valuable skills and experiences, while boosting your CV.

The **Agence du Bénévolat** is a great way to discover associations, projects and missions that match your interests and skills. Volunteering offers the chance to help others while gaining new experiences and personal growth.





LEISURE ACTIVITY YOUTH LEADER



If you're great with kids and excited about the idea of helping out at summer camps or similar activities, there are plenty of opportunities out there! Every year, lots of kids head off to camps where they're supervised by young people like you. You could be one of them! When you join a camp, you'll earn some pocket money. Keep in mind that it's not a salary but rather a fun opportunity to discover new job opportunities.

Excited to get started? All you need is to do the *Brevet Animateur*, which is available in different levels. The *Brevet A* will enable you to work in daytime activities organised by youth structures or holiday activities organised by local municipalities. If you are 16 or over, you can also start with the *Brevet B*, which gives you the opportunity to work during overnight camps. These certifications are offered by several organisations in Luxembourg. On the website animateur.lu, you will find all the accredited organisations as well as the schedule of upcoming sessions you can register for.

EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITY YOUTH LEADER







Do you want to take your animateur journey to the next level? Consider becoming an educational activity youth leader (Animateur spécialisé) at the National Youth Service (SNJ)! Once certified, you'll have the opportunity to work under contract in a wide range of fields and activities in the 5 youth centres of the SNJ. This is an exciting step towards developing your skills and making a meaningful impact in your community.

The aim of this training course is to train you in a range of sports and educational disciplines in order to equip you with the skills needed to lead a group of young people. The courses are held in Luxembourgish and are aimed at people who plan to work in a youth centre of the SNJ during the week, weekends or school holidays.

Language requirement: Luxembourgish





DIPLOM+



Do you have a secondary school diploma, a technician's diploma or an equivalent diploma? Are you still unsure about your future plans or not quite ready for your first job or university? If that's the case, then the Diplom+ might be the perfect opportunity for you! This short programme consists of several modules that allow you to unsubscribe at any time while receiving a certificate for the modules you have successfully completed. The programme lasts up to three trimesters and provides you with:

- cross-disciplinary skills that are in high demand on the job market;
- soft skills to prepare you for higher education;
- · know-how for everyday life;
- an internship to use the skills you've acquired.

REPLACEMENT IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS



Are you interested in working in education? A gap year is a great opportunity to explore whether teaching in primary schools is the right career for you.

You will be responsible for temporarily replacing teachers who are on leave in Luxembourg's primary schools. These placements are a great way to gain experience in a classroom setting and learn more about the education system, while also contributing to the education of students.

WORKING IN LUXEMBOURG



If you want to save up some money for higher education or for travelling during your gap year, you might consider working in Luxembourg for a few months.

For example, you could look for a regular short-term contract in sectors that interest you. This can be a great way to gain initial work experience while exploring potential career paths, Ideally, it will allow you to clarify - based on your decision - your choices. Alternatively, if you've recently graduated from high school or university, you can take up a holiday job within 4 months of graduation. These contracts can last up to 2 months per year and are a great way to save money for your future plans.

VOLUNTARY SERVICE











Are you interested in making a full-time commitment to a charitable project for up to 12 months? If you're aged between 16 and 30, voluntary service could be the perfect opportunity for you! This full-time engagement not only allows you to contribute to a meaningful cause, but also helps you gain practical experience, boost personal growth, and develop skills that can enhance your CV.

While participation is entirely free, you'll get a small allowance along with insurance coverage during your service. You'll also have the flexibility to choose the duration of your commitment, which can go up to a year. The minimum duration of your commitment depends on the selected project. At the end of your service, you'll receive a certificate.

In Luxembourg, three voluntary service programmes are coordinated by the National Youth Service (SNJ):

- Luxembourg: Service volontaire national
- Europe: Service volontaire européen (European Solidarity Corps)
- Worldwide: Service volontaire de coopération

WORK & TRAVEL











Work & Travel, also known as a working holiday, is a cultural exchange programme that allows young nationals from Luxembourg to discover New Zealand, Australia, Taiwan, Canada, Chile, South Korea and Japan. This programme is developed by the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs, Defence, Development Cooperation and Foreign Trade (MFA) through agreements with partner countries on working holiday visas.

The primary goal of the programme is to foster cultural immersion and strengthen international exchanges, turning travel into more than just a holiday—it becomes an opportunity for personal and cultural growth! By immersing yourself in new cultures, trying out different jobs and gaining hands-on experience, you'll not only get to know yourself better, but it will also help you find out what you want to do in the future.

DISCOVEREU & INTERRAIL





Are you looking for an exciting way to explore Europe during your gap year? DiscoverEU and Interrail offer unique opportunities to discover new countries and cultures!

- **DiscoverEU**: If you're 18 years old, you can apply for a free travel pass through the DiscoverEU programme. This initiative gives young Europeans the chance to explore the continent at their own pace by train.
- Interrail: Interrail passes are available to travellers of all ages and offer flexible and more affordable access to trains all around Europe. There are lots of different ticket options, which allow you to plan a trip that fits your schedule and interests.

Both options are excellent choices for a gap year, allowing you to explore Europe by train while building independence and self-confidence.

LANGUAGE STAYS







A language stay is a period spent abroad with the aim of learning, improving or perfecting a language in the country where it is spoken. This trip can be an excellent way to discover a city or a country and, above all, open up new horizons for your professional and personal life. Additionally, a language stay can boost your confidence and foster greater independence.

Accommodation is often with a host family and stays usually last between 1 and 4 weeks. Such stays often include activities such as excursions, sports and cultural events.

AU PAIR



If you enjoy working with kids or have babysitting experience, becoming an au pair is a great way to live in a new country while gaining valuable experience. This role involves living with a host family and taking care of their children, allowing you to fully immerse yourself in the local culture and improve your language skills. Along with hands-on experience in childcare and household management, being an au pair helps you build a close relationship with your host family, fostering cultural understanding and enhancing your communication skills. It's a good opportunity if you're considering a career in education, childcare or social services.

WORLDWIDE OPPORTUNITIES ON ORGANIC FARMS









Worldwide opportunities on organic farms (WWOOF) connects volunteers with organic farms around the world, providing an opportunity to learn about sustainable farming practices and work in more rural areas. Volunteers usually work between 4 and 6 hours a day in exchange for food and accommodation. Tasks can vary from harvesting and planting crops, field work, DIY, cooking and animal care. This platform is ideal for those interested in working outdoors and living with a host family or community, which gives you the chance to meet new people, learn new skills and connect with nature.

Opportunities vary depending on the type of farm, location and season, making each experience unique.

As you can see, a gap year offers many opportunities and diverse experiences, both in Luxembourg and abroad. During a gap year. you don't need to limit yourself to just one option!

For example, you could start with a short-term job in Luxembourg to save money and gain valuable work experience all at once. Upon return, you'll have the option to continue your studies or enter the workforce, equipped with a fresh set of experiences, skills and lasting memories.


TIPS & TRICKS


TIMELINE


FINISHED HIGH SCHOOL>>>




FINISHED BACHELOR>>>
